GETTING HERE IS HALF THE FUN!

By Car & Ferry: The Washington State Ferries Terminal is located in Anacortes, about two hours north of Seattle/SEA (Seattle-Tacoma Intl. Airport). Drive your car onto the ferry, or park at the terminal and travel as a walk-on passenger. The leisurely ferry ride displays the Islands' beauty, with a choice of four stops – Lopez, Orcas, Shaw or Friday Harbor/San Juan Island. Make a vehicle reservation at

- By Passenger Ferry or Water Taxi: A seasonal ferry runs between Port Townsend and Friday Harbor; find other options below or on our Getting Here webpage.
- By Air: The closest major airport is SEA. You can also possibly fly to Everett (Paine Field, PAE) or Bellingham (BLI). You can then transfer to a small plane to the Islands, or see options below.
- By Airport Shuttle or Rental Car: Shuttles and rental cars are available at SEA, PAE and BLI.
- By Boat: There's moorage throughout the Islands, see VisitSan uans.com/marinas.
